Winter Community Forums 2020 Q&A

1. Is there a new goal end date for fundraising the money needed for a new pool?

The Sandusky Education Foundation is still looking to raise an additional two million dollars (approximate) for the Pool Project. It has been a few years since the first estimate, so the Foundation anticipates the cost may be slightly more after the bidding process. The Sandusky Education Foundation is looking at about 12-18 more months of fundraising.

2. When will the Family Health Services Clinic at Sandusky High School be operational?

The Family Health Services Clinic at Sandusky High School is now open! Services that are provided daily at the clinic include physicals, immunizations, sick visits, minor injuries, asthma, other physical health concerns, mental health, emotional health, and services supportive of a person's overall mental well-being and daily functioning. Appointments can be scheduled daily by calling 419-984-1042. Students and staff may also be seen daily by the family nurse practitioner through walk-in visits.

3. Will district 3rd grade students have the opportunity to sign the Sandusky Intermediate School gym floor too?

As a district, it was decided that the current 2nd graders would be the class to sign the gym floor because they will be the first class to go all the way through the Sandusky Intermediate School. All district 1st graders will be signing the Sandusky Primary School gym floor in the upcoming weeks. Due to time and space restraints, these are the only classes who will sign the gym floors.

4. What are the official names of the new buildings?

The official names of our elementary buildings are Sandusky Early Learning Center (Preschool and Kindergarten), Sandusky Primary School (1st and 2nd grades), and Sandusky Intermediate School (3rd – 6th grades). When deciding on names, the Board of Education wanted to stick with something that would reflect and represent the entire City of Sandusky.

5. Will bus stops be different next year?

Yes! With the release of our 2020-2021 school year bell schedule, we were able to decrease our busing perimeters from .5 of a mile to .3 of a mile. Since we will be in our new building configurations and will be able to service more students, our bus stops will be changing. New bus stops and schedules will be released with plenty of time for our families to plan ahead.

6. Is the last day of school changing for elementary students?

At the February Board of Education Meeting, the Board is scheduled to vote to change the last day of school for students in preschool through 6th grades to May 29th. This change will allow us to begin transitioning into our new buildings. If this change is voted in favor of, we will communicate clearly with all families in a timely manner. We are also working with community organizations to provide opportunities for students to attend programming and be fed breakfast and lunch that week.
