1964-65 Varsity Cheerleading Team

The 1964-1965 Sandusky High School Varsity Cheerleading Squad of Kathy (Silcox) Holmes, Betty Jo (Palazzo) Woodruff, Beatrice (Smith) VanMeter, Jenny (Till) Schoewe, Jackie (White) Day, and Kathleen (Ross) Parzynski are being inducted into the Sandusky High School Athletic Hall of Fame for creating the school mascot - "Streaky Bear" - exemplifying their spirit and pride in Sandusky City Schools. As stated in The Sandusky Register the "Sandusky High School's mascot, 'Streaky Bear' was an idea created during the 'Sensational Sixties' by the Class of 1965. Streaky Bear was a vision born from the 1964-1965 cheerleading squad". (Nearhood, C. (2022, October 14). "Sandusky Class of '65 to Honor Mascot". Sandusky Register, P. A3)



Captain Kathy (Silcox) Holmes, brought the bear idea to the cheer squad during summer cheerleading practices based on her knowledge of "Buzzy the Bear", a 1950's Medina High School mascot. The cheerleaders expanded

on the idea to create "Streaky". Although the bear was planned to be first introduced during basketball season, the idea caught on early during football season. He started to appear as a two-dimensional design on Senior Spirit badges worn on Football Fridays and in ads in the school newspaper, "Sandusky Hi-lites", promoting the annual Fall dance - the Pigskin Parade. The bear, "Streaky", appeared as a three-dimensional character as the centerpiece of the Pigskin Parade in November 1964. As the basketball season began, a small white stuffed bear was featured in pre-game routines by the cheerleaders, sat with the Pep Club during home games, and traveled with the squad to all the away games. During this time, "Streaky" was always referred to as "Streaky the Bear", although as years passed became known as "Streaky Bear".

The "Streaky Bear" image has been in continuous use since being created by the 1964-1965 Cheerleading Squad as a symbol of Sandusky Spirit and Pride. The Class of 1965 has continued to promote and support "Streaky Bear" over the years, making him an honorary member of the Class of 1965 during the 50th Class Reunion, dedicating a 14" x 18" bronze plaque to Sandusky High School on the history of "Streaky Bear", and presenting monetary class gifts for the "Streaky Bear" costume.

Although the early 1960's did not offer sports for girls, the Varsity Cheerleaders provided a vital role in developing school spirit. The 1964-65 Varsity Cheerleaders had a vision to create the school mascot "Streaky Bear" to symbolize the spirit and pride of Sandusky High School. The induction of the six varsity cheerleaders into the Sandusky High School Athletic Hall of Fame will memorialize the importance that girls had in sports during that period of time and the impact of the school mascot - "Streaky Bear" - over the years.



Dan L. Poggiali

Dan Poggiali always has been and always will be a Blue Streak. Dan was born and raised in Sandusky, graduating from SHS in 1971. The only time he lived outside of the Sandusky area was when he attended college at The Ohio State University, where he graduated with a BS in Education in 1976. Dan began his teaching career at SHS in 1977 as a Social Studies teacher and football coach. He also taught at Adams Junior High for 4 years. Dan absolutely loved teaching during his tenure at SCS.

In 1990 Dan earned his Master's in Educational Administration from Ashland University. In 1996 he became the Adams Jr. High Principal. In 1998 he became an Assistant Principal at SHS. From 1999-2013 Dan was the Sandusky High School Principal, which was by far his favorite job in his educational career. He truly enjoyed working with his amazing staff and students. After a three year retirement, Dan returned to SCS as the Chief of Staff and Transformation Officer from 2016-2019.



Sandusky City Schools has played an important part in all areas of Dan's life. His father, Richard Poggiali (1946), and his mother, Marilyn McGory Poggiali (1948), were both graduates of SHS. His father spent his entire career in education, first as a teacher and then as a principal at Madison and Ontario Elementary schools. Dan's wife, Elizabeth, taught English at SHS for 30 years. Dan's children are also both SHS grads: Jennifer (Dave) Buening (2002) and Lucas (Tatum) Poggiali (2012). Both children (and their spouses) continue to impact others as they all are working in the field of education. Dan is also a very loving Poppa to his two adorable granddaughters, Ella Buening and Harper Poggiali.

Dan Poggiali "bleeds Blue Streak blood". He began going to SHS football games in the late 1950's as a young boy and then cheered on the Streaks at Strobel Field during the "Sensational 60's". He is proud of the years he spent as a football player for SHS and is honored to be inducted as a member of the 1970 Football Team. For Dan, Blue Streak Football came full circle when he began taking his very young son Lucas to all of the games. Then, at six years old, Lucas began assisting his dad with Friday pre-game meals. Lucas was in awe of those high school players and he had extreme respect for Coach Larry Cook.

Years later, nothing made Dan happier than watching Lucas play quarterback for the Streaks on Friday nights. All Lucas wanted to do was work hard and lead the Blue Streaks to victory on the football field.

Dan Poggiali loved supporting all sports, clubs and activities at SHS. Dinner time at the Poggiali house usually wasn't a sit down experience because Dan (and Jenn and Lucas) were always busy attending/participating in a school event. It was chaotic and challenging at times, but Dan wouldn't change a thing. His love for Sandusky High School always has and always will run deeply.

Tonight is a very special night for Dan Poggiali. To be inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame the same night his son is being inducted means everything to him. And what makes it even more special is now there will be THREE generations of Poggialis in Sandusky's Athletic Hall of Fame. Richard Poggiali (1946), Dan Poggiali (1971) and Lucas Poggiali (2012) all have lived by the saying "Once a Blue Streak ALWAYS a Blue Streak!"



Lucas Poggiali is a 2012 graduate of Sandusky High School. Lucas was a three-sport athlete participating in Football, Basketball, and Track and Field earning 9 varsity letters in total.

During his two full seasons as starting quarterback for the Blue Streaks, he led the team to an overall record of 16-7 and two playoff appearances. In 2010, the Blue Streaks won their first playoff game in 20 seasons, knocking off the #1 seed Avon Eagles. It was also their first playoff appearance in that same span. The following season, the Blue Streaks participated in the Northern Ohio League for the first time ever and finished the regular season with a 9-1 record and an NOL Championship. During his football career, Lucas broke multiple passing records and earned various post-season awards. When he graduated, he held records for passing yards in a game (390), passing yards in a season (2,170), passing yards in a career (3,770), passing touchdowns in a season (26), passing touchdowns in a career (39) and most total yards rushing and passing in a career (4,572). He still holds all but two of those records. Following the 2011 season, he was named 1st Team All-NOL, 1st Team All-NW District, 2nd Team All-Ohio, and Sandusky Register Player of the Year. He also served as one of the team captains his senior season and earned three varsity letters.



In track and field, Lucas was a four-year letter winner, team captain and standout in multiple events, but specifically the 800-meter run. He was named the middle-distance runner of the year on his team for four consecutive years. In 2009, he was a member of the track and field team that won the GBC Championship and District Championship. He also was a member of the 2011 District Champion team. He won the GBC championship in the 800 as a freshman in 2009 and won the NOL title in the same event in 2012. He was a four-time regional qualifier in the 800-meter run, and 2 time qualifier in the 4x400. He was also a member of the record holding 4x1600 meter relay team with Alvin Kirksey, Xavier Seavers, and Talon Flohr. That group set the record with a time of 19:32.20 in 2010, and it still stands to this day.

As a basketball player, Lucas was a two-year letter winner, team captain and a member of the 2011 sectional championship team. He was also named the Derrick Dickey award winner, which is presented to the player that best exemplifies leadership, competitiveness, and sportsmanship.


Lucas attended Oberlin College where he studied economics and continued his football career as a four-year starter at quarterback and four-year letter winner. He was a two-time captain and holds the school record for passing yards in a game (506). When he graduated, he was also second all-time in yards, touchdowns, completions, and attempts.

After graduating from Oberlin, he started his coaching career at his alma mater, coaching running backs during the 2016 season. The following year, he accepted a position coaching quarterbacks at Marietta College, a title in which he held for five seasons. In his final two seasons with Marietta, he served as the team's offensive coordinator as well.

In January of 2022, Lucas returned home to his alma mater when he was hired as the head football coach at Sandusky High School. He is incredibly proud to be serving and coaching the student-athletes in Sandusky City Schools. He is married to Tatum Poggiali, a 2012 Margaretta graduate and in 2022 they welcomed their daughter, Harper, into the family.

He is extremely proud and humbled to be joining this illustrious group of athletes, school officials, and community members. He's so excited to be joining the HOF with teammate, co-captain, and friend Mike Brown. The bond between teammates is irreplaceable. Lastly, what makes him the proudest is to be honored this evening with his father, Dan, as both are joining Richard Poggiali, Lucas' grandfather, as members of the Sandusky High School Hall of Fame. The following is an article written about the 1970 Football team titled "Streaks Start Super Seventies" written for the Sandusky Register by Tommy Stauffer. All credit belongs to Tommy Stauffer.

For the past ten years the Sandusky Blue Streaks have posted one of the most impressive records in high school football. During the Sensational Sixties the Blue Streaks rolled over opponents with an awesome ground attack and a stingy defense. Although the 1970 version the Sandusky Blue Streaks is somewhat different than the teams of the sixties in technique, the results remain the same. Coach Gene Kidwell's second year at the helm has truly started the Super Seventies.

In the past the Blue Streaks have been blessed with super stars. The Williams brother, Balconi, Healy, Kaser, Darden, Rather, and a list that goes on and on. But this year the pattern of the Big Blue has changed.

Although the performances of Mark Deming, Tony Harris, Jeff Ward, and Tom Swank have been outstanding, the Streaks have relied on unity, teamwork, and determination to be number 1.

It appears that the injury-riddled Streaks were in trouble midway through the season when they dropped a 12-6 decision to Findlay. With quarterback Ben Chapman, and split end Scott May on the sideline with injuries, it looked as though the Blue Streak dynasty over opponents would end. Fans were predicting a 7-3 record at the best. But with Junior Bobby Jackson at the controls, the Blue and White shifted into high gear and started to roll. An upset over the Pioneers from Elyria, a romp at Fremont, and another impressive win over Lorain Admiral King have put the Big Blue back on top in the Buckeye Conference.

Senior Mark Deming has lead the Streaks ground game with over six hundred yards and senior lineman Tom Swank is a sure bet for all-state honors.

Senior Tony Harrris summed up the Blue Steak attitude the night before the Elyria game. He said, "We'll be ready, we are not losers, we're winners".

The Blue Streaks of 1970 truly are a group of winners who have started the "Super Seventies," and they are led by a winning individual who has a driving desire to be the best, Coach Gene Kidwell.



Lynn (Daniels) Amison-Dupree

Lynn (Daniels) Amison-Dupree is a 1967 graduate of Sandusky High School. At that time, there were no organized track and field programs for female student athletes at Sandusky High School but Lynn had always been fascinated with those male superstars of the 60's.

Lynn's unique talents were first discovered by Sandusky's Jaycees when she ran against girls her age in the Sandusky Citywide Junior Olympics. Running with her hands in her pockets, she easily won 1st place in the girls' 50 and 100 yard dashes. She also received first place honors in the standing and running broad jump.

In recognition of her talents, the Sandusky Jaycees invited Lynn to attend a banquet where they asked her parents if they could sponsor Lynn along with several other outstanding Sandusky High School male athletes. Sponsoring her meant she was pulled from her high school gym classes at the end of the school day to be coached by Coach Tony Munafo, after school at Strobel field where the boys practiced.



At request of the Sandusky Jaycees, Coach Munafo agreed to coach and prepare Lynn for State Wide Junior Olympic competitions. Lynn ran against girls who had been a part of organized AAU sports programs and High School Girls track teams all over Ohio. She generally took first place in all her scheduled events.

There were several articles written in the Sandusky Register that attest to her talent and accomplishments. One article in particular describes how Paul Garrett, one of Sandusky's outstanding student athletes is showing Lynn, Tom Darden, and George Garrett, how to prepare for quick starts when running fast paced races. Although Isavelt Amison is not viewed in this article he also was given an invitation to run in the Junior Olympics, state wide.

After high school, Lynn attended college at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio. She then married Isavelt Amison. They had two boys, Brian and Kevin Amison. It should be noted that Isavelt and his brother Willie are inductees into the Sandusky Hall of fame. What an example these two have set for Lynn's children and grandchildren. After teaching in Elyria for a few years, Lynn went on to Baldwin Wallace College where she received her Master's Degree in Education.

After 38 years of successful teaching for the Elyria City Schools, Lynn finally retired from teaching. However, as soon as summer vacation ended, The Elyria City Schools were calling her back to the classroom. Thirty-eight years has now turned into 50 years of teaching service.

It was legendary coaches like Tony Munafo and Gene Kidwell, when naming a few of Sandusky High School's talented and great coaches, that not only groomed Lynn for her future, but they showed her why it was so necessary to build and sometimes rebuild powerful relationships that impact us today. When asked why her career in teaching has been so successful, she attributes it to the fact that she has become the kind of teacher-coach her favorite coaches had been! With a few teaching awards under her belt, she concludes that when you do what you love, you will always love what you do!!!



Mike Brown was a 2012 graduate of Sandusky High School. Mike was a member of Football, Track and Field, and Wrestling program during his time a Sandusky High School. Mike earned a combined 11 varsity letters. Mike earned 1st Team All-Ohio his senior year of High School in Football. Mike also earned All-Ohio in wrestling during his junior and senior year placing 7th at the State Tournament in 2011. Mike placed 5th at the Track and Field State tournament his senior year at Sandusky High. Mike served as the team captain for all three sports he participated in during his senior year. Mike is the son of Lisa Nolder. Mike signed his National Letter of Intent to play football for Eastern Michigan University on full athletic scholarship. Mike earned 6 varsity letters in college (5 in football and 1 in track and field). Mike earned his varsity letter and appeared in 6 games his true freshman year before suffering a season ending foot injury. Mike was a member of the Eastern Michigan Men's Track and Field Team 2013 competing in 3 meets and earning his varsity letter. He accumulated 35 total starts as a defensive tackle during his last 4 seasons with Eastern Michigan. Mike ended his collegiate football career with 112 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks. He was selected as a Team Captain and led his team to the FBS D1 Popeye's Bahamas Bowl making it Eastern Michigan University's first Bowl Game Appearance in 29 seasons. Mike graduated with a Bachelor's in Criminal Justice in 2017.

After graduating college Mike attended Wayne County Regional Police Academy and graduated in 2017. Mike has worked as a Police Officer in Michigan for 6 years. Mike is currently employed with Northville Township Police Department and serves as the School Resource Officer for Northville High School. Mike now lives in Fenton, Michigan with his wife, Shelby, and is expecting his first child in July. Although Mike has been gone physically from Ohio since 2012, he will always call it home! Once a Blue Streak, Always a Blue Streak!





Joseph K. Groscost is a 1961 graduate of Sandusky High School. As a swimmer, Joe was a three-year letterman in diving and a state qualifier in 1959, 1960 and 1961. All three years saw Groscost on the podium at the state meet as he placed in the top six each year. He was district runner-up in 1960 and 1961. Joe's senior year was topped off with winning AAU National Jr. Championships.

Joe went onto dive at Ohio Wesleyan University where he lettered in 1963, 1964 and 1965. During his college career Joe was an Ohio Athletic Conference finalist from 1963 thru 1965. In 1964 Joe become an NCAA Small College Finalist. He has been inducted into the Ohio Wesleyan University Hall of Fame.

For the next 47 years "Coach Groscost" mentored swimmers in Northwest Ohio. During his tenure, Coach Groscost won 162



League and District Championships. His dual meet record of 845 wins are tops in Ohio. He has served as the President of the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association, Editor of the Ohio Weekly Newsletter, authored 28 articles and wrote a widely read book: "The Basic Swimming Guide". Coach Groscost was named the District Coach of the Year seven times. He was the runner-up state coach of the year 5 times and was named the 1980 Girls State Coach of the Year.

Joe Groscost has a list of coaching achievements too numerous to mention. In the sport of swimming, Joe Groscost - for more than 64 years - has been nothing short of spectacular. Joe and his wife Barbara (class of 1967) share two children, Hannah and Hans.



Jim is a 1969 graduate of Sandusky High School. His three sisters are also proud SHS graduates: Lois W. Hart ('65), Martha B. Hart ('66) and Laura K. Factor ('83). Jim is also a member of the Sandusky High School Hall of Fame as a member of the 1968-1969 basketball team, which was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2015. Jim played center on that Buckeye Conference Championship team.

Jim was a two-year starter as tight end on the Blue Streak football team and also played defensive end. He earned two varsity letters in football. He was a class officer for three years and President of the A Capella choir his senior year.

Jim was a three-year starter as tight end for Ohio Wesleyan University (O.W.U.) under legendary Coach Jack Fouts. Jim was awarded four varsity letters and was co-captain his senior year. He was a first team All-Ohio Conference starter as a tight end in 1971 and was selected as the starting tight end in the first Annual All-Ohio Shrine Bowl game played at Ohio Stadium in December 1972. Jim also played in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl in 1971, which was played in Phoenix City, Alabama, on Thanksgiving Day.



Jim was a member of the Battling Bishops team when they won the Ohio Athletic Conference Championship in 1971. That team was recently recognized as a Team of Distinction by Ohio Wesleyan University. At O.W.U., Jim was president of the Phi Kappa Psi fraternity and president of the A Capella choir. Following graduation from Ohio Wesleyan University, Jim earned a Master of Arts degree from the University of Cincinnati, where he was a member of the U.C. Conservatory of Music Chamber Singers.

In the fall of 1975, after graduate school, Jim and his college sweetheart, Mary Ellen Gray, were married in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. They moved to Columbus, Ohio where Jim worked at the Capitol with the Legislative Service Commission. They then moved to San Antonio, Texas where Jim obtained his law degree from St. Mary's University School of Law. Mary Ellen taught reading in the San Antonio Independent School District. Following law school, Jim and Mary Ellen moved to Galveston, Texas where Jim practiced law and Mary Ellen taught English.

The Harts returned to Jim's hometown in 1981 and Mary Ellen, an Iowa native, quickly embraced Sandusky as if she was fifth generation Sanduskian. Jim and Mary Ellen are the proud parents of three children who also graduated from Sandusky High School: Dr. William K. Hart '00, James R. Hart III '02, and Mary Emma Gray Hart Avila '05. Mary Ellen was a devoted and revered Sandusky High School guidance counselor who retired in 2015. Jim is a practicing trial lawyer at Sandusky's Flynn, Py & Kruse and has been practicing for more than four decades. He is past president of the Erie County Bar Association. He is licensed to practice in the U.S. Supreme Court.

In March 2018, Jim was presented a "Lifetime Achievement Award" in recognition of his support for education and athletics in the Sandusky City Schools. Jim served on the Sandusky Board of Education from 1984 to 1998 and was President of the Board from 1996-1998. He co chaired no fewer than five school levy campaigns. Jim is a long-time board member of the Blue Streak Booster Club and is a long-time co-chair of the Blue Streak Golf Scramble. He spearheaded the project to raise funds for workout equipment in the Wilbert Schwer Fitness Center. Jim headed the funding project to raise funds for the original Conference Championship banners hanging in the school gym. Jim also has had our beloved block letter "S" and lightning bolt registered for both federal and state intellectual property protection. These Blue Streak symbols are not only protected but have become uniform in shape and color.

As an original member of the Sandusky Education Foundation and current board chair, Jim is committed to this wonderful organization in its efforts to help raise funds needed to build the new Aquatic Center for Sandusky City Schools and the greater community. A ground-breaking is anticipated in June 2023. Jim is currently on the Board of Trustees at Firelands Regional Medical Center and a former member of the Bellevue Hospital Board. He has served numerous terms on the Grace Episcopal Church vestry as well as served as the church's Senior Warder.



Albert "Al" Hess was a 1934 graduate of Sandusky High School. Al was a three-sport athlete who excelled in football, basketball, and track. His play on the field was rewarded with being named All Ohio and 1st Team All Little Big Seven multiple times. In his senior year, Hess led the Blue Streaks to an undefeated 11-0 season. He was a four year letterman in basketball and like football was captain his senior year. He was such an important member of his basketball team, he made headlines, not for scoring, rebounding or assists but for being injured and unable to play.

In track, he was a member of the state qualifying half mile relay team. In all, Hess earned 8 varsity letters in three sports.

Albert Hess's contribution to Sandusky was not limited to high school sports. After high school graduation Al worked at the Plum Brook ordnance plant where he was a police officer. In 1 943, he joined the Sandusky Police Department. In 1955 he was promoted to detective sergeant. For 21 years he was a



prominent member of the SPD until he retired as Chief of Detectives in 1963. From 1965 to 1972 he served as Erie County Sheriff. From 1972 to 1977 Hess spent the last of his 34 years of public service as a probation officer. Albert Hess died in January of 1978.

He was survived by his wife Laurabel (of 43 years of marriage), son, Staff Sergeant Steven Hess, and six grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his son, Albert. H. "Skip" Hess Jr. in 1959.

Al Hess spent a lifetime serving his school and community.



Trey Keegan is a 2011 graduate of Sandusky High school. While attending SHS, he earned 7 total athletic Varsity Letters: 2007-2011 Golf (4) and 2008-2011 Baseball (3).

During Trey's 3-year varsity Baseball career he earned 1st Team Greater Buckeye Conference (second base) his sophomore year, 1st Team Greater Buckeye Conference (catcher), and 1st Team All-District 9 his junior and senior years.

Trey currently holds SHS records in the following categories:

- Single Game 10 RBIs
- Most RBIs in a season 40 (twice)
- Most RBIs in a career 100

Over his career he compiled a batting average top 10 (.370), top ten in hits (81), second in runs (88) and second in doubles (18). He also received Academic All-Ohio in 2011.



After a semester at Ohio Dominican, Trey transferred to Bowling Green State University for 3 years. During the 2015 season Trey was a Johnny Bench Semi-Finalist for best collegiate catcher in the country and a 2015 MLB Draft Round 14 pick 420 by the Atlanta Braves as a catcher. He played 2 full seasons in Minor Leagues prior to being released.

He is the current National Account Manager for US Lumber, a building materials distributor based in Pensacola, Florida.

He is married to Marina Keegan; together they have two daughters, Mia and June Keegan.





The 1969 track team had great success throughout the season. They won the Bellaire Relays and the highly-regarded Marion Night Relays. The team was also the prestigious Buckeye Conference Champion. In 1969, school classifications were different then they are today. Sandusky High School was a "AA" size school, which placed the track team in the big school division in the state. In spite of this, the team finished only 6 points out of first place for a 6th place finish in the state championship meet. In 1969 only the top 5 place winners were recognized. The team was led by a collection of Sandusky Hall of Famers. Lavon Jackson placed 5th in the 220-yard dash, Steve Rogers placed 3rd in discus and the relay team of Lavon Jackson, Richard Deeter, Bo Rather and Elmer Lippert was the 880-yard relay State Champion. This team's outstanding season-long performance ranks it as one of the best of all time at Sandusky High School.

These individuals have distinguished themselves as successful adults in their respective careers. This would include those who have received honors through meritorious service in selected careers and/or have served as benefactors of mankind.

Criteria for Nominations

- A. All candidates must be nominated on an official Hall of Fame nomination form. The candidate must be eligible in one of the following categories:
 - 1. The nominee, if an **ATHLETE**, must wait at least 10 years from the time his/her class graduated from Sandusky High School. He/She should have earned two or more varsity letters in at least one sport and must have made an outstanding contribution to the athletic program during his/her tenure.
 - 2. The nominee, if a **COACH**, must have departed from the Sandusky High School athletic program for five years, and must have made an outstanding contribution to the athletic program during his/her tenure.
 - 3. The nominee, if a **SCHOOL OFFICIAL**, must have departed from the Sandusky City Schools for five years, and must have made an outstanding contribution to the athletic program during his/her tenure.
 - 4. The nominee, if a **COMMUNITY MEMBER (George Mylander and Ed Hartung Community Member Award)**, will be considered if they have made ongoing and outstanding contributions to the athletic programs at Sandusky High School.
 - 5. The nominee, if an **ATHLETIC TEAM**, must wait at least 15 years from the year of achievement, and will be considered if it has achieved a state championship or all-Ohio recognition, and has made an outstanding contribution to the athletic programs during its tenure. Teams with conference, district or regional titles may be considered.
- B. The record and/or the contribution of the individual must be so outstanding that there is no question as to his/her qualifying for the Hall of Fame.
- C. The nominee must have demonstrated good citizenship in school and after leaving school.
- D. Nominations are due in the Sandusky High School Athletics & Activities Office by the 4th MONDAY IN DECEMBER each year in order to be considered for the following year's induction.
- E. All nominations of those not inducted will be kept on file in the Athletics & Activities Office for consideration each ensuing year for up to five years.
