1912. Harold F. Gerold who died in 1976 at 81 after serving in two world wars, was inducted into the Erie County Chamber of Commerce “Gallery of Achievers”. In World War I, he won a Silver Star as a lieutenant in the U.S. Army when he captured a German machine gun crew. He picked up a Bronze Star in World War II, rising to Rear Admiral as a Seabee in the U.S. Navy. After the war, Gerold founded a construction company, served 12 years as Erie County engineer and was a deputy director for the Ohio Department of Transportation.

1928^{1/2}. John C. Scherer recently received the Clarence W. Seavers Citizenship Award for his devoted service and leadership to Erie County as a retired Erie County Democratic Recorder. He also received a Certificate of Appreciation for over 55 years of service to the fourth degree Knights of Columbus Bishop Machebeuf Assembly 813, Sandusky, Ohio. John turned 100 years old in February 2009.

1933. Beverlie (Buck) Mayer, who passed away last year at 92, was inducted into the Erie County Chamber of Commerce “Gallery of Achievers” in April. She taught music for decades in Erie County, both in public school and in private piano and voice lessons. She founded and directed the College Women’s Chorus, founded and directed Firelands Chorus, and directed other choirs. She also raised four children, including Miss America 1963, **Jackie Mayer (1960)**.

1944. The Class of 1944 will be having their 65th Reunion on August 29th & 30th, 2009. Both will be held at the Sandusky Yacht Club.

1946. Richard ‘Dick’ Schnittker was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame On May 30, 2009. He went on to play basketball at Ohio State for another four years, earning most valuable player honors in his sophomore and junior seasons. As a senior, Schnittker was named a consensus All-American and helped Ohio State to a Big Ten Conference championship and berth in the NCAA Tournament. He averaged 17.9 points in his career as a Buckeye. His collegiate success made him the sixth overall pick in the 1950 NBA Draft by the Washington Capitols. After one season in Washington, Schnittker left for the Minneapolis Lakers and was part of the 1953-1954 championship team.

He told me, "They have no blacks in their entire workforce, not even a janitor, Alexander said. The project surpassed their goals. The buggy had a power source equivalent to a 75-watt bulb that ran for 64 days instead of the expected 21, and data streamed back to Earth for eight years. Alexander left Bendix about five months after the moon landing to work for Pratt & Whitney. He later went into banking and then education, leading the MBA program at a Scottish university. Now living in Tacoma, WA, he maintains ties to Sandusky. He plans to attend his 50th high school reunion in August. "I thank God that I went to a good school system where I had trigonometry and physics and geometry at the high school level, and it paid off," he said.

2008. **Alexander Webb** is learning to drink and eat for first time in his life at age 20. A few sips of Mountain Dew used to be dangerous for Alex. Consuming the sugary soda would send it straight into his lungs, risking pneumonia and infection. He's had pneumonia several times in his life. He now throws back about four cans of the soft drink each day. He can also guzzle water and other liquids. Food, however, is a different story. Solid substances can become stuck in his throat, choking him. Airway obstruction is a constant source of fear for the young man, and is perpetually on his mind when he's practicing eating. "It's a little scary," Webb said. Webb has dysphasia, a condition characterized by the inability to swallow correctly. Affecting about 15 million Americans, dysphasia most commonly results from having a stroke, head or neck cancer, and a variety of neurological diseases. But Webb's swallowing difficulties trace back to his birth. Born four weeks premature, Webb had a malformed jaw and mouth, low muscle tone and a tied tongue. His jaw was locked in an open position, and he drooled constantly. Doctors thought he was doomed to an early death.

Twenty years later, Webb is alive and well, and continues to excel in the face of long odds. He holds a steady job, drives, and is on the verge of some major breakthroughs. While he still requires feeding and breathing tubes, Webb is eating for the first time in his life and his speech is rapidly improving. He has learned the sounds 'p', 'b', and 'm', and he's working on 'f' sounds. "He had twenty years of not moving his jaw or tongue and now he can, so he's had to learn how to produce sounds," said Lindsey Soisson, Fisher Titus speech-language pathologist. The therapists are having to train him how to swallow solid food, because it's tremendously difficult when you're his age to learn these things. At his weekly sessions, Webb receives a new form of electrical currents to his atrophied muscles. The electrical impulses help train his pharyngeal muscles to learn the swallowing reflex, directing fluids and foods into the stomach instead of the lungs as the muscles learn to properly cooperate. Webb can now drink water, soda and other liquids. He can also eat soft foods like pudding, tomato paste, guacamole and certain kinds of chips.

On his iphone, he has the date of August 18 marked, which is when his breathing tube can be removed. It's also possible Webb could one day retire his feeding tube if he keeps working on chewing and swallowing. Alex, we wish you the best with all of your goals!

2009. For six years, **Dailyn Moore**, the Sandusky senior, worked year-round for the 14 seconds that awaited him. He holds the nation's top time in the 110-meter hurdles at 13.44 seconds. Moore established the mark at the 31st annual Pirate Relays at Perkins High School on May 7. "It was one of the most impressive high school hurdle races I have ever seen and I watched Teddy Ginn, Jr. (OSU and now with the Miami Dolphins) at the state meet," Perkins coach Shane Burrows said. Despite running a slower time of 14.12 at the Division I state championships, Moore said the highlight of his season was winning the state. He led his Blue Streaks to another Greater Buckeye Conference and Division I district championships, and earned league MVP honors for the fourth straight year in the process.



Sandusky High Ends 10 Year Run as Bloodmobile Champ



The same week Sandusky High School's baseball team won its first-ever league championship, another group of the students fell a bit short of another title, for "Most Pints Collected."

For 10 straight years, Sandusky High School students have bested the region in collecting blood for the Red Cross, and the school was poised to do it again – the 667 pints collected by five bloodmobiles would have been the most in Ohio, Indiana and Michigan. "It's always a goal of ours to do that, obviously with the focus of saving lives, but that makes it a fun goal," said Jeff Opelt, the faculty advisor for the blood drives. Unfortunately, Sandusky's dominance came to an end when John Marshall High School in Cleveland collected about 200 pints in its final blood drive, bringing their total to about 700.

"What's great about it is that Sandusky's done this for 10 years and really set the bar for everyone else," Red Cross spokeswoman Christy Chapman said. Opelt said the news is disappointing for him and the students, including the two senior coordinators, Ashley Waddington and Marley Gilchrist, but there's a sense of pride, too. "It was rewarding realizing that we've put the bull's-eye on us," Opelt said.

Tucker to Lead Sandusky Schools

Sandusky Schools superintendent Bill Pahl will retire when his five-year contract expires next year. His last day will be July 31, 2010, but the district already has a successor named to step in next Aug. 1. With one resolution the board of education accepted Pahl's notice of retirement and announced its intention to promote assistant superintendent Tom Tucker. Pahl said he wanted to give the board advance notice so they would have time to find a successor who could join the district for on-the-job training before starting full-time. Tucker left a position with Lorain City Schools last year after Sandusky's previous assistant superintendent retired. "We found an assistant superintendent I felt comfortable with filling my shoes when I retired.," Pahl said.

On April 27th the Sandusky Board of Education voted unanimously to approve a reorganization plan that includes closing Madison Elementary, moving eighth grade from Jackson Junior High to Adams Junior High, and eliminating 31.5 positions. School officials said the changes will allow the district to maintain the quality of its educational offerings in a more affordable way.

With the closure of Madison Elementary and the end of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students initiative at Campbell School, the number of vacant school buildings in Sandusky tripled this summer. Campbell and Madison join Barker Alternative School, which has sat empty since closing in 2006. Sandusky Schools superintendent, Bill Pahl said all three are on the market. 
The Sandusky City School District is asking voters to replace a 2 mill Permanent Improvement (PI) levy in November, 2009. The PI levy was first passed in 1985 to provide for the maintenance of the school district's buildings and grounds. Over the years the effective millage has been reduced to 0.8 of one mill and inflation has caught up with the school district. The current PI levy no longer provides enough dollars to address the growing demands needed to maintain facilities and provide the necessary supplies and services required to educate children in the 21st century. PI dollars cannot be used for salaries and school district operations. The PI levy currently generates \$600,000 annually and has not been increased by the voters for twenty-four (24) years. During that time period dramatic changes have taken place in education with respect to the use of the district's aging facilities.

Technology is vital to the educational process, but to update the infrastructure of aging buildings and to purchase the needed hardware and software is very expensive. Additionally, the cost of purchasing and maintaining the school district bus fleet has become exceedingly costly. Buses cost in excess of \$70,000 each. By purchasing three buses annually, each bus is in service for twelve years before being replaced. Currently, only one bus per year is purchased due to financial constraints.

After twenty-four years (two and one-half decades) inflation has put the school district at risk and it is necessary that the level of support be increased so that Sandusky City School District students have adequate facilities, educationally appropriate textbooks, supplies and technology, and safe buses for transportation.


