

Ten Things You Need to Know....

- What is Blue Streak University?

 Blue Streak University is a program designed to allow SHS Students to access college credit courses while enrolled in high school.
- When can my student begin to participate in Blue Streak University?

 Accordingly to the law, a student can access the program as early as the 7th grade. However, most students would likely begin in the 9th grade. The program begins August of 2015.
- How much will it cost?

 There is no cost to students or their families.
- What are the requirements a student must meet for Blue Streak University?
 You must be enrolled at SHS.
 - You must have a 'college ready' score.
 For some of the upper level Advance Placement Courses (AP), you need teacher recommendation.
- What does the term 'college ready' mean in reference to Blue Streak University? The term refers to a set score on the ACT Compass Exam (pre-requisite test to determine college readiness) or the ACT Exam.



- What happens if my student is not 'college ready'? Can they still participate in Blue Streak University or AP classes?
 - Students that are not 'college ready' will not be able to earn college credit. However, there are some circumstances where students will be able to enroll in an AP class with the possibility of scoring a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP exam at the end of the school year.
- How man credits is it possible to earn in high school?

 15 credits...30 credits or more! Students have an unlimited possibility to earn credit based upon their college readiness and their interests. The maximum a student can earn is an equivalent to an associates degree.
- How do I receive my official college transcript once I earn college credit?

 Our college partners provide specific directions for students to access their transcripts.

 Because college transcripts are confidential, the SHS staff does not have access to a student's transcript. Therefore, the student must follow the universities directions to access their own transcript.
- Are the classes on-site or at a college campus? What is the delivery method of these classes?
 - Some classes will be on site with an adjunct professor teaching the class.
 - Some classes will be a blend of on-site and online.
 - Some classes will be on the 'University Partner Campus' (BGSU Firelands or LCCC) In those situations, the student is responsible for their own transportation.
