My name is Trevor Hayberger and I am the President of the Sandusky High School Alumni Association.



It is with great pride and excitement that I write to you with updates regarding Sandusky City Schools and the 2021-2022 school year. The last year and a half have shown the perseverance of our district, as we have come face-to-face with the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic. I first would like to commend our faculty, staff, and administrators who have gone above and beyond to assist, engage, and support our families and students. With the ability to change, grow, and remain flexible, we were able to continue providing our students with the best educational opportunity possible.

Looking back over the past year, we have much to celebrate. Two of our schools from the Building Better Dreams Facilities Project, Sandusky Primary and Intermediate school, opened and staff and students spent the year creating new memories and traditions in these buildings. We launched our 10-year strategic plan, Envision 2030, to guide our district in transformation for years to come. Our district marketing team won a National Award of Excellence from the National School Public Relations Association. Additionally last year, our district was able to become 1-1 technology device based for our students. These are just a handful of significant accomplishments our district celebrated over the past year.

As we prepare for the upcoming school year, we eagerly anticipate everything it has to offer. This year, our key focus will be concentrating on the overall well-being and social-emotional balance of our students, faculty, and staff. We will continue to strive to advance student academics to help our students achieve their dreams. Additionally this year, we will be opening the final new school building in the Building Better Dreams Facilities project, the Sandusky Early Learning Academy. The Sandusky Early Learning Academy will open on the Hancock Site for Preschool and Kindergarten students in January of 2022. Additionally, we are in the planning stages of the Sandusky Aquatic Center Project, a collaborative effort between Sandusky City Schools, the Sandusky Education Foundation, and donors who strongly believe in the benefits of aquatic education and programs.

In closing, I would like to encourage all of our Blue Streak Alumni to become involved and engaged with all of the unique opportunities our district offers. Class of 1941




Class of 1948

"Most of you reading this are too young to remember the side wheeler steamboat that transported from Sandusky to Cedar Point. "She was the grand ole lady of Sandusky Bay." She was named the G. A. Boeckling after the longstanding developer of Cedar Point.

Her keel was laid March 25, 1909 and she made her trial runs on Lake St. Claire on June 17th. She made her first official trip on June28, 1909, carrying a capacity of 2000



people from Sandusky to Cedar Point. She served for 42 years, then was retired and towed away at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday July 10, 1952. Later during restoration vandals set her afire.

Many of you had a chance to watch the movie "Swan Song" written and directed by Todd Stevens ('85), and filmed here in Sandusky. Todd's elementary teacher shared the following remembrance.

"It all started in a little red schoolhouse that was perched on the top of a little hill. Well, not really, there was no little red schoolhouse perched on the top of a hill. But, maybe it did start in my 6th grade classroom at Osborne School.



Todd Stephens was a student of mine. I had given an assignment to the class to prepare a skit based on a commercial. The students did all the preparation of their own. They produced the final product.

As I sat at my desk facing the coatroom, out of sight, I could hear Todd's group busy preparing their skit. I had no idea what they were doing. Then all of sudden, they put up brown paper that completely covered the doorway entrance to the classroom. There was lots of chatter and I wondered what was this going. Then "bang," someone who was stuffed with paper to look a lot bigger than he was, burst through the brown paper. It was the Kool-Aid character. I think the group was singing, "Kool-Aid Kool-Aid tastes great...". It was so funny. Todd, I could tell, was in charge of the production and direction. He was the one giving the orders. So, maybe it did start in my classroom.

Also, that year, he might have done it previous years too, Todd organized a haunted garage. The two-car garage was his parents located on Central Avenue. Todd and his buddies charged \$.25 to enter through the man door. I remember climbing over something to get inside. Once inside there was a maze of ghostly zombies popping out to scare the visitors. It was so much fun. Another example of Todd's producing and directing at an early age."


