An Update from the Chief Executive Officer and Superintendent

Hello Fellow Blue Streaks,

As we prepare to wrap up the 2017-2018 academic year and look forward to our summer programs, our Blue Streak Pride is alive and well. We've had a terrific year, both in the classroom and on athletic fields of competition. We are prepared to send yet another senior class into the world, well prepared to pursue their dreams and aspirations. Becoming the Chief Executive Officer and



Superintendent of Schools in my hometown is one of my most cherished accomplishments. All alumni should be very proud of our students, faculty, administration and school board members as we focus on our key organizational theme of "Building Better Dreams."

There are a number of significant and historical activities occuring this summer that all SHS graduates need to know about. We have so many exciting things going on that there is not enough print space to share everything, but I will include the highlights. This summer, we are making some amazing and dynamic improvements to our high school. For the first time in 60 years, we are building new science, physics, biology and chemistry labs. This will allow our students to have 21st century learning tools at their disposal and ensure they can be competitive in a global environment. 

As I have been around manufacturing environments now for some time, I have learned that what once existed in Sandusky Schools was one of a kind and unlike any place else. It was common knowledge by area employers that if you came from Sandusky's Vocational Programs, you knew what you were doing and were a solid candidate for hiring. Sadly many of these classes and programs no longer exist. As I talk with others from many other school districts around Ohio it was quite clear Sandusky's Industrial Arts was undoubtedly second to none!

The teachers I had were Mr. Alexander in 7th, Mr. Boltz in 8th, Mr. Lenhart -Metals, Mr. Cornwell -Construction, Mr. Schweinfurth -Graphic Arts and Electronics, Mr. Bailey -Architecture, Mr. Buck -Drafting, and last but not least Mr. Fial's -Photography class, probably the most fun I've ever had in school! Thank You.

Terry W Everson: With kudos to all the teachers mentioned, I'd like to go back another generation and add a few more names: Mr. Carpenter, Mr. Clark, Mr. Coe, Mr. Wagner, Mr. Homer Smith, Mr. Madama, Mr. Mackey, Mr. Shillman, Mr. Leslie, and of course my dad, Mr. Wayne Everson. The last two headed the second largest trade school and adult education programs in the state of Ohio. My dad designed the industrial arts wing of the "new" high school on Hayes Ave. Those guys helped a lot of young men, some of them with very troubled lives; find good, well-paying jobs, something that is vitally needed now.

Introducing the Sandusky Education Foundation: Enriching the Educational Experience

In 2013, a group of dedicated alumni and friends of Sandusky City Schools led by Jeff and Lauralee Krabill established the Sandusky Education Foundation as a tax-exempt non-profit organization to support the programs and initiatives of our school system. For several years this group worked diligently to raise the seed money to formally launch the foundation, and in November 2017 they hired local non-profit development and fundraising professional Jennifer Lippus as the first full-time Executive Director of the organization. Jennifer's focus is on



securing contributions that will be used to benefit both the capital and operating needs of the Sandusky City Schools.

Why a Foundation?

The assets of an independent foundation can be invested in ways that protect the principal funds while creating the best return on these investments. In addition, while the Ohio Revised Code closely defines how public entities such as school districts can do business, foundations provide an opportunity for benefactors to more closely define how their money is used. Furthermore, foundations can protect the anonymity and privacy often sought by donors.

Our Mission

The mission of the Sandusky Education Foundation is to support the Sandusky City Schools in providing a challenging and enriching educational experience that maximizes the learning potential of every student and prepares them to succeed in the 21st Century.

Goals

The primary goal of the Sandusky Education Foundation (SEF) is to provide resources and supplemental educational tools to support the learning environment at all levels, from pre-Kindergarten through high school. Sandusky City Schools Aquatic Center Project



WHY DO WE NEED A NEW AQUATIC CENTER?

The current Sandusky High School pool is 61 years old. Pipes are rusted, decks have deteriorated and are less than half the width of those in modern facilities, light levels are well below the recommended minimum, and the swim lanes are more than two feet narrower than a standard competition pool. To best illustrate the seriousness of the need for a new facility, due to a long crack along the bottom of the pool, we currently lose water at a rate equivalent to completely draining the entire pool 3 times in a single calendar year.
