Sandusky City Schools Levy Fails by 16 Votes

A 3.98 mil SCS levy on the November ballot failed by 16 votes slowing needed upgrades for the district. If passed, the district would have built two new state-of-the-art elementary buildings at the Hancock and Ontario sites with over half of the cost funded by the Ohio School Facilities Commission, improved emphasis on Pre-K instruction; and implemented significant upgrades at SHS including science labs, technology labs, an engineering fabrication Lab, an Art Academy and a Mathematics Collaboration Space.

Streaky Bear Turns 50

Streaky Bear, the iconic mascot for Sandusky City Schools turns 50 this year. His (or her) initial appearance was at the Pigskin Dance (now Homecoming) in November of 1964.

Streaky was the brainchild of Kathy Silcox Holmes, captain of the varsity cheerleaders in 1964-1965. She originally got the idea from her older brother, Gary, who had dated a cheerleader at Medina High School. They had a teddy bear for their mascot called Buzzy the Bear. Kathy envisioned a mascot to use with the floor cheers at varsity basketball games.



The first Streaky was a navy blue and white stuffed teddy bear, adorned with a crocheted tam hat. It was thought that a more powerful Streaking would suit the sports teams better, so SHS art teacher Don Nath along with student Beatrice Smith VanMeter put together a large plaster-of-Paris Streaky on wheels. It sort of resembled Yogi Bear wearing a varsity sweater and carrying a football in one hand and a Blue Streak flag in the other. It could be pushed around on a wheeled platform. A picture of the original Streaky is in the 1965 Fram on page 66.

The first costumed Streaky debuted in 1967-1968 with a white paper mache head trimmed with white fur. Again, it was designed in Mr. Nath's art class and usually worn by someone on the reserve cheerleading squad. Paula Siegel Barone, class of 1968, and Barb Schweinfurth Deming, class of 1969, both cheerleaders, recall the first costumed Streaky as resembling a polar bear and being very heavy and hot.

Streaky Bear, the Sandusky City Schools mascot, has endured for 50 years and is as loved today as he (or she) was at his inception in 1964. Both male and female students have had the privilege of being Streaky Bear. The person playing Streaky Bear usually remains a mystery until the end of the school year.

Streaky, today, is a large blue and white bear that has been refashioned several times over the year. Streaky cheers with the cheerleaders and is recognizable by virtually all Sandusky City Schools students.

Happy birthday, Streaky, and many, many more.

Recipes . . . The Alumni Association's Facebook page has seen a flurry of activity recently as members reminisce about their favorite foods from Sandusky City Schools and share recipes gathered from the remarkable staff people that made them possible. There are too many recipes to share in one newsletter, but we will continue to print them in future issues until they have all been shared. Meanwhile, we're still hoping for a recipe for hamburger gravy and for apple crisp.

SANDUSKY HIGH SCHOOL PIZZA BURGERS

11/2 lbs. ground beef1 can tomato paste2 tsp. sugar1/4 tsp. dried red pepper flakesSalt and pepper to taste1 package hamburger buns

small yellow cooking onion, chopped
cans water (use tomato paste can)
tsp. dried oregano
tsp. dried parsley flakes
Yellow American cheese, grated

In a skillet, brown ground beef and onion together. Drain and set aside. In a saucepan, mix tomato paste, water, sugar, oregano, pepper flakes, parsley and salt and pepper. Simmer on low until very hot.

Combine sauce with beef/onion mixture and heat through. When mixture is hot, spoon on hamburger bun halves, top with grated American cheese. Arrange pizza burgers on a cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees until cheese is bubbly. Makes 12 to 16 open-face burgers.

MRS. PHYLLIS POLE'S SALMON LOAF (served in the SHS cafeteria during Lent)

1 can of salmon	1 and 1/3 ounces of grated cheese
4 eggs	1 tablespoon of lemon juice
1 stick of melted butter	3/4 teaspoon of black pepper
1/2 tablespoon of salt	1/2 cup of chopped onions
1 cup of milk	seasoned bread crumbs

Mix all of the ingredients and place in a baking dish. Cover the mixture with seasoned bread crumbs and place in a preheated oven at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes. While the mixture is baking, make a white sauce with 1/4 cup of butter, 1/4 cup of milk and 1/4 cup of flour. Prepare this over low heat. Add chopped celery (amount according to your taste). Some cooks will precook the chopped celery in a little butter to soften it before adding it to the white sauce. Cut the casserole into squares and put some celery sauce over it before serving.

BLUE STREAK BARS

1½ cups peanut butter	$\frac{1}{2}$ cup plus 1 tbsp. thick hot fudge topping
1 ¹ / ₂ cups finely chopped peanuts	1 lb. plus 2 cups confectioner's sugar
1/₂ cup cold water	21/2 tbsp. butter, melted

Place peanut butter in a mixing bowl and beat well until fluffy. Add fudge, peanuts, sugar, water and melted butter and continue mixing until well combined. Spread into a 9-by-13-inch pan and chill well for at least one hour. Cut into squares and serve. Makes 15-24 bars.

BASIC DESSERT CREPE BATTER (Mr. Schumm's French classes) Yield: 20-25 crepes

4 eggs 2 tablespoons of sugar 1/4 cup of water cup of flour
cup of milk
tablespoon of melted butter

Mixer or whisk method: In a medium bowl, beat the eggs. Gradually add flour and sugar alternating with milk and water, beating with electric mixer or whisk until smooth. Beat in melted butter. His grandmother used this traditional French method.

Blender method: Combine ingredients in blender jar; blend for about a minute. Scrape down sides with rubber spatula and blend for another 15 seconds or until smooth. (Mr. Schumm used this method)

IMPORTANT: Put the batter in the refrigerator and let it set for at least an hour before using it.

You can cook your crepes in a crepe pan or frying pan in butter. Put in enough batter to cover most of the pan. Cook over medium heat -one side at a time. Take them out of the pan and fill them with your favorite fillings. Bon Appétit!

CINNAMON CRISPS

1 lb Margarine	1 lb Brown Sugar
1 cup Granulated Sugar	Add 2 Eggs
4 cups Flour 1 tsp Baking Soda	1 tsp Cinnamon
	1 cup Granulated Sugar 4 cups Flour

Form in a roll and refrigerate. Then cut slices and bake at 350* for 12-17 minutes

HS SUGAR COOKIES

Cream one cup margarine and two cups white sugar together.

Then, add: 3 eggs, 2 tsp vanilla, 1 tsp lemon extract or juice

Now add alternately to the mixture:

- 1 cup sour milk or cream 5 cups flour
- 2 tsp baking powder 1 tsp baking soda

Glaze before baking with a paste of sugar and just enough water to make a thick paste. Rub on with fingers. Bake at 350 degrees F for 12 minutes.

In the solemn tradition followed at Arlington National Cemetery, Major James S. Hildebrand was buried on July 21, 2014.

Major Hildebrand was a native Sanduskian. His son, Jim, has written a stirring history of his father's years in Sandusky and beyond:

Dad graduated from Sandusky High School in 1951. While there, he played varsity football and tennis. I know he ran track but I'm not sure if he was on the varsity team. After going to Kent State for at least a year, he joined the Air Force. While in the service, he continued his degree and graduated through the University of Maryland.



He retired from the Air Force after 20+ years. As you may know, he did two active tours in the Vietnam conflict, flying 129 missions in all.

After retiring, Dad worked at various jobs and did some teaching. His love for teaching never left him. One of my favorite stories deals with a time when he worked with a friend at an area country club. He helped that fellow worker learn to read while sitting with him at lunch every day. That was Dad...always there to help.

There are so many great stories about him...but it is best said that Dad was just that: a great father and person. I miss him every day and look forward to a day when I may see him once again."

SHS alumni need to know that the entire Sandusky community and Jim's Sandusky friends were represented at his final Arlington memorial tribute. Our son, Thomas, (who lives in Arlington and is a veteran of the Naval submarine service) was invited by the Hildebrand family to be present for the ceremony as a reminder of Jim's extraordinary time with us here in Sandusky.


