

## Philanthropist and Educator George Mylander

Local philanthropist and educator George Mylander, 83, died January 3. A full list of his many accomplishments in Sandusky can be found in his obituary on the Groff Funeral Home website. He spent 27 years with the Sandusky School system retiring in 1987. He taught at Campbell Elementary School and went on to be principal at Sycamore School and Monroe School before returning to Campbell as principal for the last 10 years of his career.

### **Lincoln Impersonator James Getty**

Former Sandusky High School choir director (1969 – 1974) Jim Getty died September 26, 2015 in Gettysburg, PA, where he had worked for many years as a Lincoln impersonator. He even portrayed Lincoln at Gettysburg on November 19, 2013 – the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Gettysburg Address. He returned to Sandusky in 2006 and performed for students at Venice Elementary School and also portrayed Lincoln in 2012 for the Firelands Symphony Orchestra's performance of Aaron Copland's "A Lincoln Portrait"


